One of the great pleasures a boater can enjoy is **sleeping onboard.**



The calming sound of waves gently lapping against the hull can lull even the most wound-up insomniac into a peaceful night's slumber.

As with real estate purchases, the first thing to remember is location, location, location.

Your choice of anchorage, particularly while you're trying to master the basics, is key to a worry-free night. For that reason, you'll want to choose a small, protected cove.

Weather conditions can change in a hurry, so give yourself every chance for shelter. If you are overnighting at a dock be sure you are tied securely and your boat fenders are in the right position. OK, now just lie back and enjoy a good night's rest at sea !!

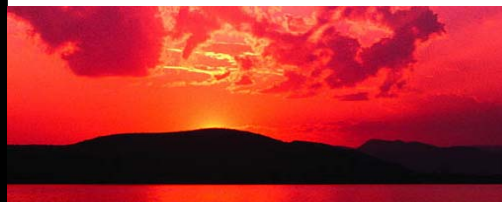


GEORGE FUJIMOTO

Gone but not Forgotten !!

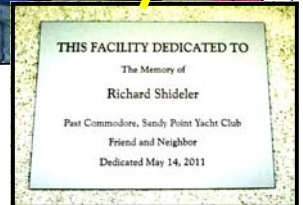


Opening Day 2011
